THE ROAD TO BERLIN - 1944-1945

I am currently working on a book about the Allied ground advance from Normandy through France, the Low Countries and on into Germany, right up to the end of the war in Europe and the subsequent Victory Parade in Berlin. The book, which has been commissioned by ARMS & ARMOUR PRESS, an imprint of CASSELL PLC of London, will be mainly a photographic record of the advance, containing some 200 photographs, plus selected map sources, etc. Naturally I want to cover as many as possible of the units of the American, British, Canadian, French and other Allied forces that took part in the battles, so I am searching for suitable photographs to truly represent their finest moments in the struggle. I need to find, therefore, some 50-75 black and white photographs of the Canadian ground forces which operated there.

If you would like to help me will you please let me have suitable copies of any relevant unit photographs, which you consider should be included. Obviously the cost of photographs must be taken into consideration and I shall be able to pay more than £4 - £5 for each photograph published, including any reproduction fees. I will of course take care of any photographs loaned to me and return them once the book is published.

I have to complete my work by 1st September 1998, so I need to collect the photographs by early 1998 at the latest.

I should explain that I am a retired British officer with 32 years service in the Royal

Tank Regiment, after which I was the Director & Curator of the TANK MUSEUM at Bovington for 12 1/2 years and had the great pleasure of being a member of the OMMC during that period. I have been writing military books for some 20+ years, mainly about tanks and armoured warfare.

Mr. Dan Potvin was born in Ottawa, Ontario on 6 June 1948. He graduated from the University of Ottawa with a degree in Business Administration. He also has a certificate in Museum and Art Gallery Management from the Banff School of Management.

From 1972 to 1993 he has held various positions within the Federal Public Service, including National Historic Parks and Sites, Conservation Division; The Secretary of State, Minister's Office; The National Museums of Canada, Canadian Conservation Institute, Canadian Heritage Information Network and the Mobile Exhibit Program; The Royal Commission on the Economic Union & Development Prospects for Canada and the State Ceremonial Program also with The Secretary of State.

He is currently the Staff Officer Museums, with the Directorate of History and Heritage, National Defence Headquarters. He is responsible for the Canadian Forces Museum System comprised of 60 museums nationally, Secretary to the Canadian Forces Museum Committee and Departmental advisor to the Organization of Military Museums of Canada, Inc..
